# LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE

# DIRECTOR

Dear friends and music supporters,

What a year it has been! Progress continues even while we endure the losses of musicians and friends – both young and old. The highlight of 2024 is the compiling and release of the first-ever Greater Cleveland Music Census. These findings have helped to guide us as we expand our ever-growing programs and services to support live local music.

Look for the details of this amazing work throughout this report; here are a few highlights:

- **Cleveland Rocks Shop** – expanded hours for retail shopping and hosted monthly **Professional Development Workshops**, followed by the **2x4 Songwriter Showcase** where four local musicians perform two songs, on every third Monday.
- **Music Incubator Program** – guided the third cohort, this year comprised of seven local musicians, who received professional input and financial support to broaden their careers and increase their income.
- **Waterloo Makes Music** – hosted 11 live events, with 22 bands and solo artists and we revived December’s **Winterloo on Waterloo**, a holiday, day-long celebration at five venues on Waterloo Road, culminating in the feature performance by the Ohio City Singers
- The fundraising initiatives continue to thrive! In collaboration with Collision Bend Brewery, **ROCK ON Red Ale** was brewed to raise funds for our mission: to support and preserve Cleveland’s popular music culture and enrich local social welfare and economic growth by stimulating music-centered initiatives. We hosted our 3rd annual **Rock Solid Gala**, an evening celebration that continues to inspire and celebrate, while raising significant funds. And we launched a year-end campaign this December which expanded our individual donors.

Again, I remain grateful for our small yet mighty part-time team of staff and consultants who kept the momentum going as we increased services and enhanced revenue, and to the amazing leaders from our committed Board of Directors, who guide us and support us as we continue forward.

Lend a hand and come out to the shows – I’ll see you there!

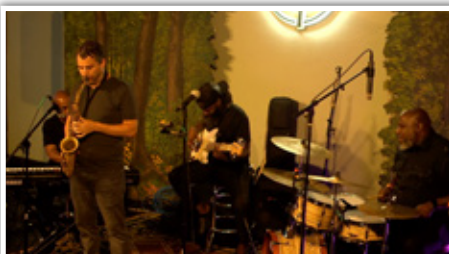

# MUSIC INCUBATOR PROGRAM

**Up to  
\$2,000  
in support**

**The CR:PPF Music Incubator program is a micro-loan and round-table community based small music business support group.**

Local artists present project proposals, get connected with other artists and support volunteers, share ideas and opportunities, direct a conversation around their projects and music. Artists are eligible for loans up to \$2000 for the projects they propose. Artists participate in workshops, professional development, and performance opportunities. The Music Incubator program accepts applications once a year.

In 2023, the second Incubator class was selected after fielding many applications. Ten applicants were interviewed and 5

artists/groups selected to participate. The 2023-2024 incubator class included Clare Feorene, Kid Tigrrr, Corry Michaels, Thor Platter and Wave Rowanne.

**Funding for the 2023-2024 Incubator class was distributed for the following:**

- Clare Feorene: Tour and concert support. Merchandise creation (t-shirts and handmade CDs)
- Jenna Fournier (Kid Tigrrr) - Vinyl record album manufacturing
- Corry Michaels: Social media marketing campaigns
- Thor Platter: T-shirt manufacturing with profits used to make a new record
- Wave Rowanne: Advertising campaigns on social media to promote merchandise and ticket purchases

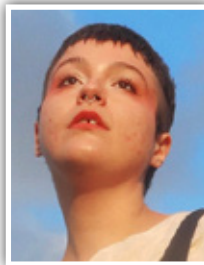

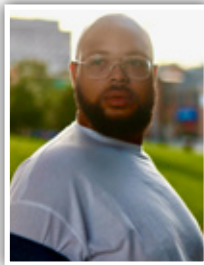

# MUSIC ACCELERATOR PROGRAM

**The Music Accelerator program is one of the CR:PPF's programs to connect Greater Cleveland music artists with resources necessary for success.**

The Accelerator is aimed at artists who have developed a fan base in the local scene who are working to expand their reach and raise their profile regionally and nationally. CR:PPF knows we have world-class talent here, and we have to work to let the world know it. The Accelerator works by providing artists in the program access to professional services, expert advice, and

network building. Accelerator artists are selected by CR:PPF staff, board, and advisors.

Two groups were selected in 2023 for our first Music Accelerator class – **Maura Rogers & The Bellows (MR&B)** and **Apostle Jones**.

With the generous support of donors Anjie and Jim Anderson, Maura Rogers & The Bellows headed into the studio to record a live album. Apostle Jones used their loan to purchase merchandise. With additional support, we hope to grow this program.

# WORKSHOP SERIES & 2X4 SONGWRITER SHOWCASES

The Professional Development Workshop series launched in 2022 to offer resources for artists to help move them forward in their career. Workshop topics include music technology, business, networking, and professional development. We have invited guest speakers and panelists to lead these workshops, as well as offer demos and interactive experiences to attendees.

Our workshop program grew from 8 events in 2023 to 12 in 2024, which included three events dedicated to mental health and wellness. Our popular **2x4 Songwriter Showcases** returned for the second year in a row. The 2x4s feature 4 solo or duo acts performing 2 songs each directly following the workshop discussions. The workshops are recorded and the 2x4 songwriter showcases livestreamed on Facebook and YouTube.

The Cleveland Rocks Shop is a retail space for local music and merch, honoring Cleveland’s rich musical history. The store is managed by Cleveland Rocks:PPF, and sells both wholesale and consigned goods from local bands and artists. The Cleveland Rocks Shop also serves

as a community gathering space for workshops and small concerts.

2024 marked the first full year that the Cleveland Rocks Shop was open for business as a retail store. In 2024, we hosted 16 free events in the space including 4 concerts and 12 workshops. We continue to work to expand our inventory, range of

offerings, and programming to better serve the needs of the community.

In 2024, Terry Stewart’s previous donation of vinyl records brought in more than \$1,900 in sales alone. We are grateful for community support that helps keep our shop up and running. The Cleveland Rocks Shop operates on consignment and donations.

# WINTERLOO ON WATERLOO

On December 22, 2024, CR:PPF hosted our first winter music festival – Winterloo on Waterloo – which featured a full day of local bands and musicians performing holiday music and originals at various venues along Waterloo Rd.



Winterloo’s afternoon events were all free including performances by Martini Five-O, The Super Babes, Hubbs Groove, and various singer songwriters. The festival culminated at the Treelawn Music Hall with a ticketed performance by The Ohio City Singers. At each stop along the way, attendees could purchase raffle tickets to win a gift bundle which included a CR:PPF beanie, 4-pack of ROCK ON Red Ale, and vinyl. We hope to grow this concept into an annual event for the community.

# GREATER CLEVELAND MUSIC CENSUS

**The Greater Cleveland Music Census is a community-led initiative to gain a better understanding of the current needs of the Cleveland-area music community.**

The Census – which closed on Dec. 15, 2023 with more than 2,700 respondents – captured key information about the Cleveland music economy to help the city and community make more informed, data-driven decisions to support the music ecosystem.

The census asked questions specific to the realities of music and live entertainment workers, including general information about their demographics and occupation types as well as their perspective on issues such as diversity, equity, and belonging.

The Greater Cleveland Music Census was made possible by a \$25,000 grant from the Cleveland Foundation with efforts executed by the Cleveland Rocks:PPF, Cleveland Independent Venue Association and Texas-based partner Sound Music Cities.

The respondents were made up of 74% music creatives, 18% industry professionals, 8% venue owners and presenters of live music.

A few takeaways:

- Cleveland is very livable with 91% reporting they have health insurance and 66% own their own home.
- A vast majority of respondents would like to see a music commission created at the city or county level, similar to Austin or Nashville.



- Respondents are looking for more opportunities to perform, improve marketing, diversify the scene, foster mentorship, and offer more professional development

Census results were revealed at a special event held at the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame on August 29, 2024 which featured guest speakers Jason Hanley from the Rock Hall, Cuyahoga County Executive Chris Ronayne, State Senator Kent Smith, Cindy Barber, and Sean Watterson.

Some music announcements shared at this event included:

- State Senator Kent Smith unveiled plans to use liquor taxes to create a live music fund.
- Cindy Barber shared that CR:PPF received a \$200,000 grant from the state to build out a NEO Music Hub.
- The Rock Hall, in partnership with Destination Cleveland, unveiled a new online music calendar for Cleveland concerts called Hello Cleveland. [www.hellocleveland.live](http://www.hellocleveland.live)

During the night, we heard from Senator Kent Smith, Cindy Barber, Jerry Mizer, and Terry Gilbert about all the work being done for our music community and how we can all join in these efforts to further our reach.

Attendees were also able to bid on 25 raffle prizes and 20 silent auction items,

which included house concerts, studio recording time, tickets, framed photographs, gift baskets, merch and more. Congratulations to our silent auction winners who won house concerts. This year, we were able to raffle off house concerts with 12 different bands and artists. Congratulations to winners Jules and Fran Belkin, Brian Lane & Doug Hester, Anjie Anderson, Susan Dean, Jamie Belkin, Stephanie & Paul Lang, Terry & Robin Gilbert, Joe Kerrigan and J. Davis.

Eugene Catering provided light hors d'oeuvres during cocktail hour, followed by a seated dinner during the event.

The event was a huge success and raised **\$55,000** to help support the

local music community – \$19,000 more than the prior year. It was a night full of good energy and passionate city leaders, movers and shakers.

# ROCK ON RED ALE

In 2024, Cleveland Rocks:PPF collaborated with local brewery Collision Bend on a new beer to support local musicians – ROCK ON Red Ale.

CR:PPF’s staffer Kim Henderson designed a custom can for the beer highlighting the local music scene and artists. ROCK ON Red Ale even took the spotlight at each table as centerpieces for our 2024 Rock Solid Gala. A portion of beer sales directly benefit Cleveland Rocks: PPF, which, when paired with a great tasting beer, is a winning combination. On initial launch, this beer was available at Collision Bend locations, The Beachland Ballroom and The Treelawn.



A partnership between Cleveland Rocks: Past, Present and Future, the Youth Resiliency Institute and the National Rites of Passage Institute, SOUL CITY CLEVELAND Stories is a culturally responsive community arts pilot project designed to connect youth participants residing in under-resourced communities to elder Black artists through generative immersion. This partnership has become the foundation for programming that provides performance opportunities for Cleveland’s music legends where they share the stage and mentor Cleveland’s emerging musicians.

In 2024, SOUL CITY CLEVELAND partnered with community-based youth arts organizations and schools for VIP

sneak peek screenings of the upcoming independent documentary “SOUL CITY CLEVELAND” by film director Fanon Hill. On May 15, 2024 - Cleveland Senior Citizen Day - students from the Kenneth W. Clement Boys’ Leadership Academy were the special guests for the first screening. The event also included a Meet and Greet with Cleveland’s Soul Superman, Arthur “Art” Blakey, and respected community elders from SOUL CITY CLEVELAND’s Education Advisory Committee.

Later that month, youth and families from Golden Ciphers Youth Development & Cultural Arts Center were invited to the second screening. The event also included a Meet and Greet with film focal point Shirley Cook, a jazz vocalist, and a captivating performance by Ms. Cook, Ed Ridley, Sunceray Tabler, and Jordan McBride!

A third VIP screening was also held with accomplished singer, guitarist, songwriter, cartoonist, and performer Eugene Ross.



This year, Cleveland Rocks:PPF also hosted a workshop with Da La Brass Band at the Beachland Ballroom. Marching band students from four high schools were invited to learn about New Orleans music and starting a brass band.

SOUL CITY CLEVELAND focuses on Cleveland, Ohio’s Black music icons - ages seventy and up— whose memory links the past and the future. Featuring legendary but under-recognized artists and figures such as Lou Ragland, Art Blakey, Shirley Cook, Wallace Coleman, George Hendricks, Vel Scott, Eugene Ross and many more.

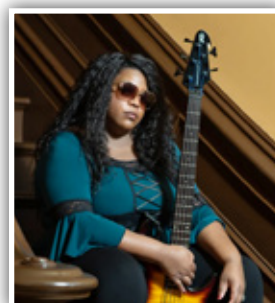
